



This post office discontinued to take effect 15 January 1903 (Papers to West Berlin, 8 January 1903)







The Boylston Center Post Office which closed in January, 1978, was officially disbanded on June 15, 1979. The postal service in Boylston was then consolidated into the larger Morningdale Post Office. A small new Boylston Center Community Post Office was opened several days later located in the Center Store. This facility provided the Center residents with Box and Window Service, Parcel Post, and most other postal services. The new facility retained the Boylston Zip Code, and was a welcomed event for the citizens living in the immediate area. Subsequently, both post offices were replaced by a new combined post office on Route 140 near town's border with Shrewsbury.
